Rowing Ireland High Performance Women's Coach

Background

Rowing Ireland is the National Governing body for the sport of rowing across the island of Ireland. To build the next chapter we are seeking suitably qualified individuals for a Women National Coach role. The Coach will work as part of the High-Performance Team to effectively maximize the performance outcomes for Rowing Ireland Team crews across the Open Senior Women category.

The Rowing Ireland High Performance vision is to have more Rowing Ireland rowers competing on the world and Olympic stage with the chances to win a medal.

The key goal of the High-Performance team is to enhance the capacity of the Ireland high performance sporting system to create long term sustainability and repeatable results at the highest international level.

The core functions are:

- Provide HP identified and potential Women athletes with the coaching they need to become competitive at World and Olympic events.
- Support the High-Performance Director, Head Coaches and HP Coaches in the development and review of campaign plans and individualized plans for prioritized athletes;
- Lead the strategy to develop and implement innovation, research, and technology solutions to improve athlete performance

HIGH PERFORMANCE WOMEN'S COACH

Reporting to the Women Head Coach and HPD, the Women Coach will be a member of Rowing Ireland HP Coaching Team which comprises six HP Coaches, Service Providers group and the Operational Officer.

The HP Coaching Team is responsible for delivering Rowing Ireland HP Plan qualifying the targeted boats for Paris 2024 creating realistic chances of medals.

SELECTION CRITERIA

The candidates applying for the role will require a range of personal and professional skills, including:

Essential Skills and Experience required

- Proven track record of coaching successful crews
- Experience in the delivery of podium capable crews
- Experience in coaching multiple crews
- Experience creating and implementing a High-Performance environment
- 5 years' experience High Performance coaching
- An understanding of the requirements of high-performance rowers
- An understanding of the components of a high-performance environment and culture
- A strong team player with excellent communication skills and the ability to build and maintain relationships with coaches, athletes and support staff
- High level of personal initiative and autonomy
- Demonstrated proficiency in MS Office Software including Word, PowerPoint and Excel.
- Demonstrated excellence in written and verbal communication and organizational skills.

Desirable

- Possess a valid trailer driver's license

IN THIS ROLE YOU WILL

- Support the Implementation of Rowing Ireland's High-Performance Strategy.
- Support the development of Rowing Ireland's High-Performance System in line with the Rowing Ireland High-Performance Director (HPD) and High-Performance team by being part of the Women Program.
- Support Rowing Ireland's Squad of Coaches in organising and developing their respective squads to deliver sustainable podium competitive performance in International Competition and for Olympic Games.
- Conduct daily training at the National Rowing Centre under the direction of the Women Head Coach and HPD.

LOCATION

The successful candidate will be required to be based in the National Rowing Centre in Cork. The role will require some travel within the Island of Ireland and overseas.

HOURS OF WORK

This is a full-time position. The nature of the position will require some extended hours and weekend work.
